

**MEMORIAL RESOLUTION
OF THE

WILLIAM P. FOX**

We are here to pay our respects to the memory of our deceased colleague and friend, William (Bill) P. Fox, who passed away on July 29, 2003, at the age of 60.

Bill Fox was born in Elizabeth, New Jersey, on February 1, 1943. He received his B.A. degree, cum laude, from Rutgers University in 1967; his M.A. in History from the University of Wisconsin in 1969; his Ph.D. in History from the University of Wisconsin in 1972; and his J.D. from Indiana University School of Law at Indianapolis in 1984. He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and the Phi Alpha Delta Law Fraternity.

Bill Fox was admitted to practice law in Indiana and the Northern and Southern Districts of Indiana on June 1, 1984. He was a long-time member of the Allen County Bar Association since his admission to practice law. He was also a member of the Indiana Bar Association.

Bill Fox was an active member of this community. He was a member of Congregation Achduth Vesholom. Bill was an avid reader, and he appreciated learning and his opportunity for a formal education. Proudly, his sons Daniel and Jeremy have completed their degrees.

Bill Fox is survived by his wife Linda C Fox, his son Daniel and wife, Toby, of Indianapolis, his son Jeremy of Creston, Iowa, a brother, Theodore G. Fox of Newington, Connecticut, a sister, Carole Barnhard of Englishtown, New Jersey, and his loving dog, Chico. He also leaves behind a beloved sister-in-law, a brother-in-law and many nieces, nephews and cousins.

Bill Fox will be remembered by his friends, colleagues and the residents of Allen County, not only for his contributions to the practice of law, but also as a good friend and colleague. Bill Fox's emphasis as a lawyer was helping those of limited means, focusing in the areas of bankruptcy and family law. He will be missed.
