CHARLES Z. BOND

The members of the Allen County Indiana Bar Association meet in sorrow this morning to pay sincere tribute to Charles Z. Bond, who died at 3:00 A.M., Thursday, April 17, 1969, in the Lutheran Hospital in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Charles was born August 16, 1911, in the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and graduated from Central High School, DePauw University and from Indiana University where he received his degree of Doctor of Jurisprudence in the year 1936.

In college he was a member of Beta Theta Pi Social fraternity, Phi Delta Phi legal fraternity, Sigma Delta Chi journalistic fraternity, Phi<sup>ETA</sup> Sigma and the Blue Key national social fraternities.

Charles was a brilliant student and was a member of the National Honor Society and at Indiana University was editor of the Law Journal.

Returning to Fort Wayne after graduation he began the practice of law in the year 1936 and was a member of the Allen County Indiana Bar Association and was admitted to the United States District Court and the Supreme Court of the State of Indiana and the Board of Immigration.

He was a life long Republican and rendered to his party loyal and extensive services. He was elected Joint State Representative from Allen and Whitley counties in 1938, 1940 and 1942.

Charles was a member of Trinity Episcopal Church, Summit City Lodge No. 170, F & AM, and the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry.

In the practice of law and in the state legislature he unselfishly gave of himself and exercised his fine talents.

Charles had great capacity for friendship and for friendliness. He will long be remembered for his inherent kindness, his great understanding and for his patience. All those who understood and knew Charles recognized his high talents and his loyal friendship.

He is survived by his wife, Ramona, two daughters, Mrs. Jean Markey and Mrs. Gordon Baney, a son, Robert Van Cleave, and twelve grandchildren. To his wife and family we give our deep and heartfelt sympathy.
