CLYDE J. COVER

Mr. President, members of the Allen County Bar Association and friends.

Once again we meet to pay homage to one of our associates who has left a heritage of service for us to carry on. Clyde J. Cover died April 23, 1981 at Parkview Memorial Hospital. It is fitting that this institution had the opportunity to care for him in his hour of need. Clyde was as responsible as any one individual, if not more, for the movement of the Methodist Hospital from Lewis Street and the creation of Parkview. After its creation he served 20 years as a Member of its Board of Directors. He was one of the leaders in the successful financial drive for all three of our hospitals.

We remember Clyde for years of activity in aiding the Red Cross, the YMCA, the YWCA, the Boy Scouts and the Girl Scouts. Seldom has one more devoted so much of his time and efforts to help the best activities and institutions in the community. In addition, to those mentioned, he also devoted his abilities to the Fine Arts in the area, especially by working with the Fine Arts Foundation.

Mr. Cover was named to the Methodist Hall of Fame of Philanthropy in 1962. In the field of education, he served on the Board of Directors of Hiram College and was an active member of Plymouth Congregational Church.

Clyde was born in Ohio, educated in Law at Harvard and was for many years an attorney with the Lincoln National Life Insurance Company. Those of us who knew him, knew him because of his vital


