As the passing of time brings greetings and farewells, we must again express a valedictory for one of our colleagues. Arthur W. Miller died on January 17, 1979, after several years of retirement from the active practice of law.

Art Miller of the gentle smile and friendly
personality was born here in Fort Wayne on January 24,

at Central Catholic High School, and subsequently at the
University of Notre Dame where he graduated with a Bachelor
of Arts Degree. He received his J.D. from Georgetown

He had been a member of the Georgetown University Alumni Club, the Notre Dame Club, The Knights of Columbus, the Elks Club and other groups of a social professional and civic nature. He was not only proud and devoted to his family, but to the church which he loved and served. He leaves as immediate survivors his wife, Juanita, a son, and two daughters.

Art Miller was a sole practitioner. He found the independence of his professional life to be the atmosphere he most enjoyed, and the situation in which he could serve

his clients with ability and personal caring and courtesy. He was a good lawyer and demonstrated that a retiring and gracious personality can be quite compatible with service, both efficient and comforting, too often forgotten in the adversary climate of this day.

Through the years, he especially enjoyed the camaraderie of his fellow young lawyers in their fun and fraternal sharing.

He was fond of life, and the joyful living of it, and he loved people and savored their friendships.

A good and pleasant man, an honorable lawyer who will be missed and held in happy memory.

Mr. President, I move that this resolution be adopted as a memorial tribute to Arthur W. Miller; that the adoption of the resolution be made a matter of record in the order books of the Courts of Allen County; and that a copy of this text be forwarded to his family.
