Our colleague, William Ralph Santa, died March 19, 1986, at his home following an extended illness. He was diagnosed as having lung cancer two years ago and was forced to leave the practice in August, 1984.

Bill was born in Ohio City, Ohio, in 1935. He worked for many years as a brakeman for the Erie Lackawanna Railroad.

He wanted more out of life and so he left the railroad, moved to Fort Wayne and went to work at Bowmar where he became personnel manager. While working at Bowmar, he obtained both a B.S. and M.B.A. at IPFW.

He was an ardent fan of car racing and of the hurrying Hoosiers. He enjoyed woodwork. He loved to go to the lake.

Bill worked hard to become a lawyer, he was good at it, he did not get to enjoy it long enough, and we miss him.
